GROSSULARIACEAE - CURRANT FAMILY

Plant: mostly woody shrubs

Stem: woody, with or without spines

Root:

<u>Leaves:</u> deciduous, simple, entire to toothed, alternate; stipules on petiole or absent

<u>Flowers:</u> usually in racemes; 4-5 sepals, 4-5 petals (often scale-like), cyclic; 4-5 stamens; ovary inferior, 2 carpels, 2 styles, 2 stigmas

Fruit: usually a berry, may be oily

Other: currants and gooseberries locally, some ornamental; Dicotyledons Group

Genera: 2-12+(?) genera; locally *Ribes* (currant)
